Dear Friends of St. Francis,



First off let me say what an honor it is to be called as your next priest. I've been on the job a little less than a week now so there's not a whole lot to reflect on, but I will share some of what I've observed and a bit more about myself. For the time being, I see my role primarily as getting to know all of you, and in doing

so I'll be able to get a good sense of the community. I've already started making appointments to visit people, but it will take some time to make it to everyone's home. I'll be doing this because I'm really interested in what you value about St. Francis. Obviously this is your Church so it must mean a great deal to you. I'd like to know what some of the best times were, what you think makes this place special now, and what are some of your hopes for the future.

Some people have already started asking me what kind of changes I would like to make, or what my vision is. As I see things, I would like to do this listening work first, so we can have some shared ownership, and when I do make decisions, I'll be confident that I'm making the right decisions. From what I've observed so far this is a community that really, really, loves each other. There is a warmth and a caring amongst the members that is extremely profound. The other thing I've noticed is how much we value our diversity. St. Francis truly is a house of prayer for all nations and it's exciting to see the cultural mix as I look out on Sundays.

So for a bit more about me, I am a person that will spend his whole life going deeper and deeper into the Faith. God certainly isn't finished with me, and I keep learning things from a variety of traditions. One of the reasons I love the Episcopal Church so much is that there's room for all of this diversity within one Communion. I'm hoping in the future to draw on various traditions from Roman Catholics, Anglicans, Evangelicals, and Eastern Orthodox Christians to help us develop our common life. And of course, there's always the teachings and example of St. Francis himself. St. Francis began his ministry with a call from God to rebuild His Church. From there he gave up his earthly possessions, and imitated our Lord in His poverty. St. Francis developed an amazing sense of inner peace and calm before The Lord that allowed him to inspire others to join him in his way of life. It was out of this poverty and his sense of peace that he moved so easily through nature, and created some of the scenes with animals that we are so familiar with.

I share all of this with you as a starting point. Throughout the next several months our conversation will deepen, and together we'll be able to discern where God is calling us over the next several years. I look forward to meeting with all of you.

I know that God cares about all our decisions and wants the best for us.


But he is more concerned about the person we have become then he is about any particular decision we might make. So let us seek his presence rather then just his plan for our life. Because the most important part of his plan is for us to have a close relationship with him.

We all know from the scriptures that we are all God's children. That his specific will for us as an individual will never contradict the principles he mentions in the Bible. Butto discover God's specific will for our decisions, we need to consult him with the understanding that God is willing to guide us, and that we are capable of receiving his guidance. We must want to hear what God is saying. We must demonstrate our sincerity by doing what God has already asked us to do and we must be open to acting upon whatever new guidance God gives us.

When I am facing a decision I use at least five ways to consider how God wants me to act: Bible reading, prayer, advice from mature Christians, an assessment of my circumstances and a sense of inner peace. I find that it is best to consider a decision in light of all these elements to be sure of God's leading. I try not to act on the basis of just one or a few of these elements unless I am in a crisis situation that must be handled quickly.

Once you've discovered God's will for a particular decision, be courageous. Act on it quickly and don't second-guess yourself afterward. Know that if you've made a honest mistake. God can always transform your situation to accomplish his purposes.





WEAVING GOD'S PROMISES

This year I am excited to tell you about a new curriculum that we are using

in most of our CF classes entitled, *Weaving God's Promises*. This new curriculum for ages 3 through the 6th grade was developed and written especially for the Episcopal Church.

Weaving God's Promises teaches children the way of Christ in the church, in the world and then gives them a solid grounding for future formation programs, preparing them for Christian adulthood. It follows a 3 year cycle dealing with the broad themes of Weaving Our Faith, Weaving Together the Family of God and Weaving God's Beloved Community. Holy Scripture, the Church, Christian Living are the three areas emphasized in this curriculum, to help build this important faith foundation in our children.

Each class will consist of gathering together, telling the Sacred Story, Prayer, Sharing and the Dismissal or Sending forth. It is age specific and includes special activities and lessons for the Church Seasons, Holidays and the Church and its Sacraments. Our capable teachers are excited

about this new curriculum and it is my hope that you will join with us as we experience, Weaving Our Faith together. Our Youth and Adult classes will continue to use the lectionary based, *Living the good News*.

If you have not yet registered for CF classes, registration forms may be found at the rear of the church and in the commons, attached to the Christian Formation bulletin board. There are many inter-generations events planned throughout the year, details will follow in the Bell and postings on the CF bulletin board.


what: Angel Choir for children








St. Francis Episcopal Church Financial Update

As of August. 30, 2010 - Year to Date Results

| Total Operating Expenses | \$112,536 | \$113,280 | \$717 |
| Net Income | \$-5,572 | \$-14,968 | \$-9,396 |
| Pledges | \$79,904 | \$85,073 | \$-5169 |

The Vestry reported earlier this year that we were headed for a negative cash flow of \$20,927 by year end. We are *happy* to report that your response to the request to keep up your pledges and for additional giving plus keeping expenses down has to date <u>improved</u> St. Francis' financial position.

However, at the present giving and spending level we will still end the year with a 10,000 - \$12,000 deficit.

Please continue your efforts to make St. Francis financially sound.
