Dear Friends in Christ,

Just this past week I had a wonderful conversation with Fr. Anderson making arrangements for the 50th Anniversary Celebration. As usually happens with us, our discussion turned to theology and its impact for our lives. Fr. Jim spoke passionately about how the Fourth of July is coming up, and how his preaching is taking a tone of true freedom and how Christ sets us free. Coupled with that conversation, I just read an article in The Living Church about how our society has grown more and more to individual wants, needs, passions, and we've become a culture of instant gratification. At first glance this may seem like a harmless vice, but the reality is that it robs us of our true freedom.

The problem with instant gratification is that it demands fulfillment – now. You have no choice. In a sense you can become enslaved to your passions. When you're enslaved in this manner, your focus becomes very much towards yourself, and you ignore others. The other thing it does is makes you very vulnerable to outside influences, which can subtly and not so subtly suggest that you need their next fantastic product, and you need it now. If you find yourself trapped in this pattern, one of the most freeing things you can do is say no. When you say no, you put yourself in the position where you can make an actual choice, rather than succumb to influences.

Sometimes the Church is criticized for all of its rules: you must fast during Lent, you can't steal, you can't covet your neighbors' possessions, you must set aside time on the Sabbath Day, you must give to the poor and work for justice, etc. etc. The reality is that these practices are what actually generates true freedom. Of course we already have that freedom through faith, but this is how we live into it. Each of these practices draws you out of yourself, and helps you to see the larger world around you. When you can stand firm in this experience, you develop an incredible sense of self-worth and dignity. Many people even experience joy in this dignity. This is what true freedom is about – knowing that you don't have to fulfill every whim to be okay, but through Christ, your better than okay, right now.

Back in the 90's there was very little information on this form of disability, so it was a rude awakening once Sharon and I started discovering what we were in for. I prayed to the lord for guidance, and he never let me down! There were a few scary situations when I was stationed at Roosevelt Roads Puerto Rico. But we got through each and every one with God's help! I truly believe that God chose me and Sharon to handle raising Andre, and I can honestly say that we did a pretty good job. Sometimes Andre would amaze us demonstrating what he was capable of doing or saying, and Sharon and I would just laugh and shake our heads in disbelief! And one of the reasons is that Andre is very intelligent in what he is capable of doing! God gives us different gifts to use for his glory, and sometime these gifts are hidden away. Unless a missing key opens up the lock to these doors one day. I am very proud of what little things Andre has accomplished so far, and I love him very much!

Capital Campaign News


