As I write this I'm reflecting on how tomorrow is the first day of September, which means Fall is here, kids go back to school, and our program year gets back into full swing. I really look forward to hearing all of our children's voices as Sunday School starts at 9:15. Each year I'm incredibly impressed at how full our classrooms are and how many people participate. It's a testament to the health of our parish.

Another thing that happens in the fall is stewardship season. This is the time when we reevaluate our time, talent, and treasure and dedicate them to God's work in the world - work like Sunday School which raises up our children in the faith. But as you have heard several times now, our stewardship this past year has not been great. We are down a considerable amount and cannot continue this trend. Each year we go through it and each year our bank account balance is nibbled away at. If this continues we will be in serious trouble before too long.

These past few weeks I've been reflecting on blessings and curses, and so I wonder how that applies to our stewardship efforts. When a Church runs well, it definitely is a blessing. Remember the definition - a blessing is something that is life-giving for you and the other person. The Church provides worship services, outreach ministries, Sunday School, Bible Study and other classes, opportunities for fellowship, pastoral care, weddings, funerals, and other important life events. I think we can agree that these are life-giving activities. But they also do cost money. And if they are not properly resourced they cease to be a blessing. The reasoning is simple. While they remain life giving for the people enjoying these ministries, they end up being life stealing from those who are continually asked to do more and more with less and less.

A world of blessing looks very different that our culture's way of buy, use, and discard. Blessings involve a cyclical relationship where there is constant giving and receiving. And when it's truly a blessing the giving and receiving are both life giving.

When the Church asks you to give its to make sure that what is life giving truly is a blessing. We want to do the life giving ministries and we want to make sure we have the resources to do them. Please consider everything St Francis contributed to your life and make sure you give in such a way that it remains a blessing.

Dear Parish Family:

Welcome back to a new Christian Formation program year! We are beginning year 3 of our curriculum, Feasting on the Word! This curriculum has proven to be a solid connection between education and worship. It is based on the Sunday Lectionary scriptures and it invites both the leaders and the students deep into the biblical lessons of our church year. Each Sunday lesson encourages faithful Christian living and a lifelong spiritual formation. Each age level provides a comprehensive, accessible biblical background from four key perspectives:

What? Are the important things to know about the contexts, language and settings of the

biblical lesson?

Where? Is God in the scripture, and His will and activities being expressed?

So what? Does this scripture mean to me?

Now what? Can we do to live out our life based on what the scripture is saying?

As we continue our new program year, we look forward to you our parish family joining with us and experiencing it for yourself. Christian Formation classes for all ages through adult will begin at 9:15 am on September 13. 

Vestry Meeting Summary of Action

Vestry Meeting—June 17, 2015

Summary of Action

May Finance Report—Dosh Jackson: Income in May was slightly higher after appeals regarding the budget deficit, and expenses were lower, largely due to the seasonal lack of demand for much heat or air conditioning. However, we still have a deficit of about \$8,500. Six-month pledge statements will be sent out in July, and automatic deduction for pledges will be encouraged.

Strategic Plan Update—Dosh Jackson: The Strategic Planning Team will continue building on the Rule of Life campaign for the rest of the year. The goal will be to get more "hands-on" about the topics in the Rule of Life that were laid out during the Easter season. Ideas include holding events such as a special end-of-summer service and creating a trifold brochure of ministries with contact information to make it easy for people to volunteer.

Building Renovations: Arrangements have been made with the contractor to carpet the vestibule, hallway, Commons, Sacristy and short hall, and the two small bathrooms. The carpet is on backorder, but work will begin in early July.

New Business

Copier: Since the current copy machine contract ends in July, the Vestry discussed options and voted to lease a copier with color and 11x17 capabilities; repairs would be included in the contract.

Fundraising/Stewardship—Ken Clarke: Plans are being made to track visually for the congregation the progress toward raising money to eliminate the deficit this year. Fundraisers, perhaps including the children, are in the works.

Ministry Area Reports:

- Senior Warden—Susan Moore: Susan reported that doors to the church have been left open more than once recently. Anyone finding a door open when no one should be in the building should not enter, but should call the police.
 - The Parish photo from the picnic was published at the top of the recent diocesan newsletter. Susan commended those who cooked and who assisted with the picnic in other ways.
- · **Social**—Karen Palmerone: Newcomer packets are now available at the back of the sanctuary on Sundays.

Volunteers are needed for the photo sessions for the directory update.

- · Christian Formation—Susan Moore: Christian Formation Director Bennett Card reports that
 - o This year's Vacation Bible School program will be G-Force (GOD Force), to be held July 20 24.
 - Bennett will be contributing content materials for the newcomer packets that Karen is creating.
 - o Mia Hurd has accepted the position of Nursery attendant and will replace Brett Iwejor when he leaves for college in August.
